April is the designated month of the military child, underscoring the important role military children play in the armed forced community.






### Water sensory play ideas

#### Flower Water

Make flower water with flowers and leaves and talk about flowers. Make flower soup/petal tea. Use outside to have a flower water tea party.

#### Pondlife

Create a pond using natural materials and add frogs and other pond creatures. Jelly and water together make a great frogspawn effect.

#### Beach day

Add sand, shells and coloured water. The children in Cyprus start to venture to the beach with the warm weather.





#### Frozen flowers

Drop flowers into the water, even using coloured water and freeze over night. Think about breaking them up with hammers for fine motor skills or watch them melt for science.

#### Spring scented water:

- ◊ Oranges, Lemons
- ◊ Rose Oil

Water trays are so versatile and toddlers love to revisit them. Try adding a few drops of different food colouring, some rocks and sand. Use silver trays to enhance the water area along funnels and drain pipes to entice pouring skills.

#### Ideas

Playdough is a fantastic resource that can be used to develop imagination, maths skills, hand-eye coordination, fine motor strength, communication and language and more!

Create Spring playdough by adding fresh lavender with white paint or fresh chives to the normal recipe. Other Spring playdough ideas include adding:

- ♦ Parsley
- ♦ Lemons
- ♦ Oranges
- ♦ Cocoa powder
- ◊ Sunflowers

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

### Fine motor control ideas

- Cress head growing
- Leaf threading—let's go and find lots of leaves on a walk
- Growing pepper seeds—let's cut the peppers and see what's inside, use tweezers to remove the pepper seeds and plant them for our very own pepper plants.
- ◊ Growing a broad bean
- Hide n Seek Insect digging and scooping
- Sunflower seeds extracting
- Peas in a pod—maths
- Mini Pancake skewers (adult led/supervised)

### St George's Day

Invite children to make flapjacks. Sharing and learning the recipe. Encourage children to weigh the ingredients. Children



can bake and take them home remember to share the recipe with the parents. Speak with ancillary for a diary free version.

### Earth Day

### Green/Yellow Gloop

- 2 cups cornflour
  - ◊ 1 cup water
- Green/Yellow Food
   Colouring
- Brightly coloured flowers for texture



### Coconut Playdough

This divine smelling playdough has a slightly powdery texture that will have you dreaming of a beach far away. Keep it in a glass jar for extra freshness.

In a small bowl, stir 1 cup of corn-starch into 5 tbsps. Of coconut hair conditioner. With your fingers knead away.

If the dough is too dry, add more conditioner one tablespoon at a time, until the dough is soft to touch.

Easter Egg Shredded Wheat Cupcakes

### Ingredients:

200g milk chocolate, broken into pieces
85g Shredded wheat, crushed
2x 100g mini chocolates
(remember do not use mini eggs as they can cause choking)

Melt the chocolate in a small bowl placed over a pan of barely simmering water. Pour the chocolate over the shredded wheat and stir well to continue.

Spoon the chocolate wheat into cupcake cases and press the back of a teaspoon in the centre to create a nest shape. Place chocolate eggs on top of each nest.
